

<u>A PASTOR'S THOUGHT</u>

"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another – and all the more as you see the Day approaching." (Heb. Ch 10 vv 24-25 N.I.V.)

Dear Friends,

Have you ever wondered why the Canadian geese fly only in the V formation? For years specialists in aerodynamics wondered the same thing. Two engineers calibrated in a wind tunnel what happens in such a V formation. Each goose, in flapping his wings, creates an upward lift for the goose that follows. When all the geese do their part in the V formation, the whole flock has a 71 percent greater flying range than if each bird flew alone. Each depends upon the other to get to its destination. Something else – when a goose begins to lag behind; the others "honk" it back into place.

This illustration from the animal kingdom points to the way the Church should be. As the writer to the Hebrews puts it, we should "spur one another on toward love and good works". We should be in the business of cheering each other on. Encouraging and blessing one another.

At our recent prayer and thanksgiving evening, that was precisely what we did. Nearly twenty people packed the manse, giving thanks, laughing, sharing and spontaneously singing our thanks for God's amazing goodness. We thanked him for new people in the church, "old" people in the church, a new front to the building, new hope, new faith and new life!

TRANSFORM 2012

Transform 2012 was an outreach programme run by Operation Mobilisation which I was involved in this summer. It started with a preparation conference in Rome for five days, then 300 or so of us, (mainly young people in their 20's) went in teams of about 12 to countries all round the Mediterranean Sea for two weeks to share the gospel in different ways; there were dance teams, a trekking team, a surf boarding team, refugee camp visits, children's camps, literature distribution and outreach at the Olympic Games in My team was based in London too! Malta in the centre of the Med at the Prayer Room where we tried to keep praying for the outreach teams 24 hours 7 days a week with the help of local Maltese Christians! Praying through the night from 10.00 p.m. till 6.00 a.m. was the hardest! I confess I only did it once and preferred getting up early to relieve the night watch!

My best experience was being invited to a Maltese home by a lady I met on the bus and getting to pray for the whole family! We are keeping in touch by text, and I hope to see them if I go back to Malta on holiday with my husband.

It was great to join ordinary folk in being a short term missionary, and we can only pray that people all over the world will hear the gospel and believe in Jesus and have their hearts transformed by God's love and grace!
