

"So I will always remind you of these things, even though you know them and are firmly established in the truth you now have. I think it is right to refresh your memory as long as I live in the tent of this body." (II Peter Ch 1 vv 12 - 13)

Jill Price has an amazing memory that has stunned scientists. In 2006, her overdeveloped memory was described in a scientific journal article, "A Case of Unusual Autobiographical Remembering." Price has no special aptitude for memorizing lists of words, numbers, facts, or languages. But she does remember what happened to her on any given day over the last 30 years. Name any date and Price will tell you what day of the week it was, the weather, what she had for breakfast, the TV programmes she watched, and the people she spoke with.



Few of us have a memory like that. That's why we need reminders to complete simple tasks and keep our appointments. This is especially true when

it comes to spiritual truth. The apostle Peter showed he understood the need of spiritual reminders when he wrote: "I will not be negligent to remind you always of these things . . . . Yes, I think it is right . . . to stir you up by reminding you . . . . Moreover I will be careful to ensure that you always have a reminder of these things" (2 Peter I:12-15).

Recently, as part of my personal prayer time, I actively recite to myself all of the good things that God has done in my life, and my churches, in the past. It is such a blessing to remember the challenges, and the way out that God provided, the way He provided material and spiritual resources for moving forward. I challenge you to do that.

- This builds faith: If you face a similar challenge you are encouraged to trust that God can do it again.
- This instils thankfulness: We humbly remember how good God has been.
- This creates community. Peter is reminding his readers. He is like iron sharpening iron, He is challenging them. So when we hear someone bemoaning the fact that things are not going the way they want, and that maybe God can't be trusted, we can lovingly challenge them to find Him in the new situation, as He was found in the past.

Can you find God in the past and the present, as you move into the future?

## UNITED MISSION TO NEPAL EARTHOUAKE UPDATE



As you know, it has been a tragic few weeks in Nepal. A 7.8\* earthquake struck

Nepal just before noon on 25 April. Houses destroyed,

ancient monuments and temples reduced to rubble, villages swept away, people traumatised.

None of our UMN or hospital staff were killed or injured, and our offices and hospitals sustained only very minor damage. This meant we were able to leap into action quickly. With the generous help of our supporting organisations and individuals around the world, strengthened by the prayers of



the world-wide church and assisted by expertise from a number of partners, we have been able to offer assistance to many affected by the earthquake.

## **DEVASTATED DHADING**

Dhading district was one of the most affected parts of Nepal. UMN has been working there for nearly 20 years and has a very competent team there, strong local connections and several excellent partners. Our work in Dhading has included:

- Sending a small paramedical team from United Mission Hospital Tansen to Baseri VDC.
- Providing food, household utensils, hygiene kits and tarpaulins in three VDCs in the south.
- Providing relief materials to four VDCs in the far north of Dhading district. Three of these VDCs have no road access; suspension bridges are broken and walking trails are blocked by landslides. The only way in is by helicopter, but getting access to helicopters has been very difficult.
- Training local health facilitators in 14 VDCs in emergency nutrition.

Altogether, UMN will be providing emergency relief support to around 8,500 households.

## SUPPORTING LOCAL PARTNERS

UMN's long-standing Disaster Preparedness Programme has trained local groups in emergency response. We have provided funding, vehicles and personnel to two of these organisations.

- Rescue Network Nepal has distributed packages that include basic shelter, food, tools and first aid to 1,500 households in Lalitpur and Makwanpur VDCs. They plan another distribution (that will also include mosquito nets) for 2,500 households.
- Nepal Christian Relief Services has distributed emergency food in collaboration with Practical Action, which provided tarpaulins, in two VDCs in Gorkha district, covering nearly 1,100 households. They are now planning to proceed to Ramechhap district.

## **PSYCHO-SOCIAL SUPPORT**


Psychosocial support is very important in helping people and communities recover from traumatic events.

- UMN's Mental Health Advisor Dr Stephen
  Coulter has been giving advice to school,
  church and I/NGO groups in Kathmandu, and
  has trained others to deliver this material also.
  UMN has produced a simple leaflet which lists
  the normal reactions to trauma, and how to
  cope with it effectively.
- Our mental health advisors are now planning psycho-social first aid training for Emergency Health Response Facilitators as part of integrated health delivery in Dhading.

## **UMN HOSPITALS**

Thankfully, neither of our hospitals in Tansen or Okhaldhunga suffered major harm. Two guest houses and some staff quarters in Okhaldhunga were damaged during the 7.3\* quake of 12 May. Patients from some of the older wards were shifted into the not-yet-completed new hospital building as a precaution.

 Both hospitals have been working to capacity, as well as reaching out into their local communities.

As Christians we know that the Bible is much more than just words on a page. It is God's way of speaking directly to us. The Bible, from beginning to end, is the revelation of Jesus Christ. Jesus was the One who spoke the world into existence and He is the One who will, in a time to come, make all things new (Revelation 21:5). He is the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end (Revelation 1:8, 21:6, 22:13). His throne is established from everlasting to everlasting (Psalm 41:13, 90:2, 93:2, Isaiah 63:16b, Micah 5:2, John 1:1-2). He is the Word of God.

John 1.1-2In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God.

## How Do You Read The Bible

There are two ways to read the Bible. One is to read the Bible looking for Jesus. The other is to read the Bible looking for oneself. We live in a time that is becoming more and more self-centred. Never has narcissistic man been more and individualistic. It's a me-focused, "ieverything" culture. Community has broken down as modern communication has built a generation that is moving faster and faster, and farther away from God's intended design. There seems to be no rest for the weary and no focus for the future. With electronic "everything" to meet one's every need and want (and to meet it instantly) man is becoming more

and more i-focused instead of Christ-focused.

While it's always important to apply the Word of God to our daily lives, we must not fall into the trap of reading the Bible as if it is all about us. It's not! The Bible isn't about us. It's all about lesus! We should approach Bible reading with a desire to find Jesus on every page, in every historical account, every song, every prayer, every teaching-in everything! That's how we will come to know Him better. When we read the Bible looking for ourselves, trying to identify with various people of ancient times, more often than not, we miss Jesus. Before we get to our lists of "lesus in the Old and New Testaments," let's first look at what God says about reading the Bible to know lesus better.

Paul wrote to Timothy about the purpose and profit of God's Word and he did so in a progression of importance:

2 Timothy 3:16 All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness.

Reading Scripture is profitable, first, for doctrine. That means "for teaching" for teaching us about our Creator and His creation, about the fall of man, and about our Redeemer and His plan of complete restoration. When we understand who God is, who man is, what God has done for us and what God will do to restore all creation. then convicted we are (reproofed) and then we are humbled to receive correction and instruction from God's Word. We must know God's ways (be taught) and be convicted and humbled before we can apply biblical teachings to our lives (application of the "instruction in

righteousness" Paul spoke of). Reading the Bible "looking for Jesus" will produce great fruit in us as we come to know Him better. The better we know Jesus, the more His Word will pierce our hearts and transform our minds.

Years ago a Christian fad was born with the introduction of WWJD bracelets. The acronym stood for What Would Jesus Do? While it's an interesting thought, it's not a very good question because the answer is most often subjective. The idea was to consider a decision you are facing and determine how Jesus would respond in the situation.

A better question, that has biblical answers, is What Did Jesus Do? (WDJD) The answer to that question is not subjective, because the Bible accurately records who Jesus is, what He did and what He will do. When facing a decision, think about what Jesus did and what He taught. Remember that in everything Jesus did, He surrendered to the will of His Father. Let God's Word teach you and always trust that His Holy Spirit will direct you.

Finding Jesus on Every Page of the Bible We all know that the New Testament books speak clearly about lesus. birth, earthly ministry, death resurrection are recorded in the Gospel accounts and His instruction for those who belong to Him completes the New Testament teachings. It's surprising to many that the Old Testament is also all about lesus. While it records historical events of real people and real places, everything points to Jesus in pattern, prophesy and type. Every page "whispers" His name. Jesus confirmed this when He walked and talked with two men on the road to Emmaus.

Don't read the Bible looking for yourself. Read it daily, LOOKING for Jesus – the Author and Finisher of our faith (Hebrews 12:2). He's there on every page! Here's a list to help you "see" Jesus on every page.

Beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself. Luke 24:27

Jesus is The Great I AM who is beyond our full comprehension. One day we will see Him face-to-face and we will fully know that HE IS EVERYTHING! He is our Saviour, our Reconciler, our Redeemer, our Mediator, our Refiner, our Advocate, our Prophet, our Priest, our King, our Bridegroom, our Physician, and more!
