HAPPY Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"See, I am doing a new thing!."
(Isaiah ch 43 v 19 NIV)

Because of Christmas, we all end the year with new things—new toys for the kids, new clothes. We start the year off with new things, too—a new calendar on the wall, new bills to pay, and new resolutions for the days ahead.

Everybody likes new things, including God. He says, "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" God begins His book with the story of His creating a new world; He ends it with His plans to make a new heaven and new earth.

Our heavenly Father wants to do new things in the lives of His children. He desires to teach us new truths about Himself, provide new opportunities for serving others, take us to higher levels of worship and deeper levels of trust. But too often we're like the Israelites when they were travelling in the wilderness.

God promised to provide for them by raining down bread from heaven six days a week. He instructed them to gather only enough manna for each day, except for the day before the Sabbath when they were allowed to store up two days' worth. When some of the people disobeyed and tried to hoard extra manna, it became rotten and full of worms by the next morning.

We're like that sometimes. God wants to do new, fresh things in our lives, but often we try to hold on to yesterday's stale manna. I don't want to let go of what is comfortable and familiar—some old way of thinking, a certain way of doing things, my usual area of service to Him. I may miss new and exciting things God has planned for me if I don't fully trust His guidance, even when He seems to be leading me down unfamiliar paths.

Look out for God's new thing happening in your life this year.

WHAT WILL YOU LIVE FOR IN 2016

Every December 31st, we become time conscious. But time is slippery, temporary. What will our time be like this next year? News shows, books, internet articles, friends tell us there is much to worry about in 2016: terrorists, the elections, the economy, the climate, social unrest. We are told any one of these things may impact the quality of life and how long we may live.

But as Paul says, don't focus on what is temporary, but focus on eternity. Faith has to do with eternity. This means that faith is rooted not in time and what happens in time. Faith is rooted in the person and character of God!



Faith is not primarily about everything working out. Faith is about knowing and

pursing the person of God. So Jesus says to seek first His kingdom and righteousness, the things that are connected to the character of God.

Those things that are not tied to the pursuit of God, like tomorrow, Jesus says not to worry about them. Even though the experts and pundits don't acknowledge it, God is in ultimate control. In this sense tomorrow and the 24/7 news cycle is not important. Don't make 2016 the year of worry.

The pursuit of God's character, His goodness, His rule in your heart, those are things that go beyond time. Those are the things that matter.

Seek the things that are related to God's kingdom, those things in this life which are connected to what is eternal. Is your spouse secure in your commitment to her or him and to God? Do you value your children as people to invest in or are you more invested in the things that are temporary? In other words are you trusting things that are temporary to let your family know how much you care about them? Relationships have to do with more than what is temporary, they have to do with God and His eternal character.

Don't measure your life and your children's lives by the pursuit of the things that are temporary.

You cannot change how long you live. You can change what you live for!

WITH GENTLENESS & RESPECT

When people first hear the word apologetics, they typically think of our modern use of the word apology. They often conclude that the task of apologetics

is apologizing for the Christian faith as if to say we are sorry for our faith. However, the word apologetics derives from the Greek word apologia, which means "to give an answer" or "to make a defence." Apologetics is not an apology, it's an answer—a defence of what we believe. In his first epistle, Peter writes, "In your hearts honour Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defence to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect" (I Peter 3:15). In his commentary on I Peter, Dr. R.C. Sproul writes:

Our preparation is to make us ready to give a defence and a reason for the hope that is in us If your neighbour says, "I notice that you are a Christian. What is it that you believe?" are you ready to explain not only what you believe but why you believe it? Some Christians tell those who inquire that we simply take a leap of faith with no bother about the credibility or the rational character of the truth claims of the Bible, but that response goes against the teaching of this text. The only leap of faith we are to take is out of the darkness and into the light. When we become Christians, we do not leave our mind in the parking lot. We are called to think according to the Word of God, to seek the mind of Christ and an understanding of the things set forth in sacred Scripture.

God calls us to be ready to make a defence for the hope that is in us, but notice that He calls us to do it with gentleness and respect. Apologetics isn't just for some Christians, it is for all Christians. We all must know what we believe, why we believe it, how to live it, how to defend it, and how to proclaim it—and we must do so with gentleness and respect.



As we flip the calendar and look ahead we as Christians are reminded of this great truth: we are closer.

We are closer to faith becoming sight and the day when we will walk in Immanuel's land. Think about this truth: with the turn of the calendar from 2015 to 2016 we are that much closer to dwelling in the everlasting kingdom of Christ!


All of the longing for full-undiluted joy will be met. All of the temptations to sin will be removed. All of the pain over fractured relationships will be healed. All of the tears over lost loved ones will be wiped. All of the lurking shadows of the evil one will be vanquished. All of the false teaching will be muzzled. I can't wait to walk with my brothers and sisters in Immanuel's land with faces made radiant by the Holy Spirit. As I turn the calendar I do so with longing; and the daily weights of life in this flesh only serve to increase it.

But, there is good news! In 2016 we are that much closer to walking in Immanuel's land. May it be soon!
