#### Abide with Me

"As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them;" (Luke Ch 24 v 15)

Two of the people in Jesus' wider circle of disciples had a miserable Sunday afternoon. Their long-awaited Passover festival had been completely ruined because of the sudden arrest, conviction, torture, and crucifixion of Jesus, their beloved Teacher. A mysterious stranger walked with them for a while on their road that Easter Sunday He led them through a Bible study they would never forget, and afternoon. somehow their hopes revived. As he explained things, forgiveness of sins and eternal life would be earned for the believers through the Messiah's suffering, death, and resurrection.

"As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus acted as if He were going farther. But they urged Him strongly, 'Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over" (Luke 24:28,29). The stranger agreed. He stayed with them and shared their meal. Suddenly they recognized that their guest was Jesus himself, alive and triumphant. Their lives would never be the same.

A Church of England clergyman named Henry Lyte longed for Jesus' comforting and abiding presence just as much as they did, and the beautiful verses he penned (authors original handwritten extract below) have become known and loved by Christians for many generations:

> "Abide with me: fast falls the eventide. The darkness deepens; Lord, with me abide. When other helpers fail and comforts flee, Help of the helpless, oh, abide with me!"

Thank God that the Stranger is no stranger, and that He walks with you all the way home.

#### **CLOTHED IN RIGHTEOUSNESS**

Hi, I'm Joni Eareckson Tada and there's lots I cannot do for myself.

And look, I don't need to list all the things my quadriplegia prevents me from doing - and, for the most part I'm okay with that. But that one thing that I really wish I could do is, dress myself. I can't pull on a sweater or a coat, button a jacket. I can't pull up my slacks or my nylons, slip into a skirt or hop into shorts. Sometimes when a friend is trying to put on my sweater, my fingers get stuck in the sleeve or I lose my balance and start to fall over. It can be a little frustrating at times. No, I can't clothe myself. wish I could do it for myself because it is, after all, a rather private thing, rather And so, in the past, I have always looked at it as a problem, but thankfully, this "problem" has always driven me to God for help. But isn't it just like the Lord Jesus to give not only grace when we need it, but help and insight.



Because the other evening—now get this—I was reading in Revelation how one day we will be "clothed in righteousness." I was intrigued by that word "clothed." So I did a quick word search and found myself in Galatians chapter 3, verse 27 where it says:

"You who were baptised into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ" (Galatians 3:27).

And that got me really going. I looked up more references and I found Isaiah chapter 61 where it says:

"I delight greatly in the LORD; my soul rejoices in my God, for He has clothed me with garments of salvation, and arrayed me in a robe of righteousness" (Isaiah 61).

I tell you, all these verses really brightened my spirit and they got me to thinking: why, when the Bible talks about our righteousness, does it always say that God clothes us? Like something He puts on us or does to us. (I mean, even way back in the Garden of Eden, it was God who provided a sacrifice and, therefore, the skins to clothe Adam and Eve after the fall).

And then it hit me: Garments of salvation and robes of righteousness. This is something we absolutely cannot provide for ourselves. God provides the salvation and the righteousness; oh, yes, we can clothe ourselves with Christ as it says in Galatians, but it's His righteousness, not ours. And so, righteousness is something, which God does to us and for us. There is nothing in ourselves we just cannot get ourselves dressed, so to speak, in righteousness. And if we did, it says that our righteousness would be as filthy rags can you imagine what you'd look like if you had to dress yourself in that? I mean, just picture a garment, a robe made out of your own filthy rags. Yuk!

Suddenly! Oh my goodness, I gained a whole new appreciation for not being able to get myself dressed. Someone else has to do that for me. That very personal and private function is performed by God

Well, you can imagine how Himself. blessed I was by that simple, sweet insight. Praise God, I cannot get myself dressed in robes of righteousness. Hallelujah, I am so happy I cannot dress myself in garments of righteousness. And, friend, you can't get yourself dressed either, someone else has to do that for you. And a Someone with a capital 'S' has graciously and mercifully done that for you. The Lord Jesus Christ is your garment of praise, and when you put on Him, you put on His righteousness. And you know what? You couldn't be decked out in a better pair of clothes.

If we were there we would have expected to see Jesus walk out into the morning light. There was just one problem. The tomb was already empty. Just as He could not be hindered from entering in a locked room, He could not be contained by the sealed tomb.

The stone was not rolled away so that Jesus could escape. It was rolled away so



that you would know that the tomb was empty. With His resurrection Christ was done with the limitations of His human body. Death and the restrictions of our flesh were conquered that Easter morning. As Paul said, death had lost its sting.

The angel of God opened an empty tomb for all to see. Jesus now moved about with the grace and power of a body not subject to the barriers and boundaries of earth. Jesus fulfilled the gospel promise made to Eve so long ago. The curse was broken.



His righteous robe.


He is our Prophet, Priest, and King, building His church, interceding for us, and reigning over all things.
